Discussion Item Smart Meters- Community concerns, long-term effects of wireless transmissions, etc.

Information and reports were submitted from K. Bagn, Rural Grand Forks and M. Limbert, Electoral Area 'A'.

The Chair welcomed the members of the public in attendance.

The Chair explained that the Board of Directors is very aware of the issues and concerns respecting the effects of wireless transmissions. However, with regards

Page 2 of 30 Board of Directors July 30, 2015 to smart meters, local government does not have any jurisdiction. She explained that Director Russell will speak to this matter and that the public may speak at the end of the agenda under Agenda Item 14; Questions for Public and Media.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, Director Russell acknowledged all public submitted materials from citizens which express safety and health concerns. He explained that the Board of Directors considers all submissions respecting the potential health risks associated with non-ionizing electromagnetic-fields from wireless devices overall and he referred to similar concerns identified in the Report of the Standing Committee on Health presented to the Government of Canada in June 2015.

The RDKB Board of Directors has recognized its responsibility for Health Protection to the Minister of Health and to BC's Chief Medical Health Officer by reporting a health hazard to the Provincial Health Officer or by taking other *authorized* actions and has agreed to bring the matter to the Board meeting for discussion.

Authorized actions are limited. There needs to be clarity as to what is, and what is not, the RDKB's mandate and jurisdiction. Local government does not have delegated authority or jurisdiction in the *Local Government Act* or the *Community Charter* to act on this matter other than to advocate or lobby Provincial and Federal Governments, and it was;

Recognizing that many scientists and cancer specialists around the world are concerned about the potential health risks associated with non-ionizing electromagnetic fields from wireless devices, and that the Report of the Standing Committee on Health, presented to the Government of Canada in June of 2015, clearly identified the same concerns,

AND recognizing that the British Columbia *Public Health Act* gives ultimate responsibility for health protection to the Minister of Health and to BC's Chief Medical Health Officer, and under Section 83(1), the Act requires that any local government must take action upon being made aware of any health hazard or health impediment within its jurisdiction by reporting the health hazard to a Provincial Health Officer, or by taking other authorized actions,

Therefore, it is resolved that the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary Board of Directors petitions the Premier of British Columbia, the Honourable Christy Clark, the Minister of Health, the Honourable Terry Lake, and the Chief Medical Health

Page 3 of 30 Board of Directors July 30, 2015 Officer for B.C., Dr. Perry Kendall to recommend review of Health Canada's Safety Code 6 to ensure appropriate protections for our citizens, based on the precautionary principle and a transparent review of the available research. **FURTHER that** the Board also petition the Government of Canada to work in collaboration with the health departments of the provinces and territories, to examine existing cancer data collection methods in order to improve the collection of information relating to wireless device use and cancer.

D. Allin, Chief Administrative Officer, City of Grand Forks re: Grand Forks 2015-2016 Strategic Priorities

The Chair welcomed Mr. Allin to the meeting.

Mr. Allin thanked the Board for the opportunity to provide an overview of the City as an organization between the years 2012-2015 and to share Council's strategic priorities.

Mr. Allin updated the Board members with respect to the City's organizational structure, customer service, current projects, grant applications, keys to successes, digitizing information through iVault and GIS systems and Staff changes through succession planning and attrition.

Mr. Allin provided information respecting the City's Strategic Plan and priorities, growth and cost reallocation, strengthening opportunities and asset management.

Director Russell thanked Mr. Allin for collaborating with RDKB Electoral Area 'D'/Rural Grand Forks in several projects and joint initiatives.

The Chair thanked Mr. Allin for the informative presentation and he was excused from the meeting.

Matt Hulse-Our Horizon re: Warning Labels on Gas Pumps

The Chair welcomed Mr. Hulse to the meeting to present information on the organization "Our Horizon" and on climate change and air pollution warning labels on gas pumps.

Our Horizon wishes to implement "label bylaws"; either municipal or provincial.

Mr. Hulse thanked the Board members for allowing him to speak and advised that he was attending the Board meeting to present information and to request support. He requested that the member municipalities take the matter of warning labels on gas pumps to their respective Councils and that the RDKB Board of Directors considers a letter of support for the District of West Vancouver's UBCM Resolution that was adopted on January 26, 2015 and which may push the Province of BC to implement the labels.

Mr. Hulse provided a power point presentation that highlighted the research that was undertaken regarding the jurisdiction of BC local governments to implement the warning labels within their boundaries. Some of the information presented included:

- 1. the level of global carbon emissions that local governments are responsible for,
- 2. statistics regarding the transportation sector and ghg emissions, exhaust from automobiles and poor air quality,
- 3. cardiovascular disease, stroke, lung cancer, leukemia and other health concerns
- 4. tobacco control, and
- fossil fuels.

Mr. Hulse addressed inquiries from the Board regarding the cost of labels to the gas operators, whether there is a similar plan for gas operators/pumps in the rural areas where there are no requirements for business licenses, messaging on vehicles and buildings and more affordable electric cars.

It was agreed that the RDKB Board of Directors would support this initiative by sending a letter to the UBCM supporting the resolution adopted by the District of West Vancouver that was adopted at a Council meeting on January 26, 2015.

The Chair thanked Mr. Hulse for the presentation and he was excused from the meeting.

Wireless Devices - Health and Safety Concerns

Marilyn Limbert noted her concerns and opinions with health and safety issues triggered from smart meters.

Director Russell acknowledged Mrs. Limbert's concerns noting that the RDKB Board will focus on the authority it has within legislation to address public concerns regarding these matters. He also advised that the Electoral Area Directors may be able to assist the public with Grant in Aid funding to help with the costs of holding community meetings.

Mrs. Limbert referred to the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen's resolution requesting the Provincial Government, including the Minister of Health to put a moratorium on smart meters. She noted that the UBCM has received resolutions for this matter as well and inquired as to why the RDKB Board of Directors does not have the same ability to do the same.

It is important for the Board to adhere to its authority through the *Local Government Act* and the *Community Charter*. Local governments have the duty to respond to health concerns, but only within the limits of authority provided in the legislation. The motion adopted earlier in the meeting stays within these limits. The resolution from the Regional District of Okanagan Similkameen is not within

Mrs. Limbert expressed her concerns that residents only have local governments to be their voice; who will be the voice if the RDKB does not act.

After further discussion, Director Russell strongly urged those in attendance to lobby the Province with letters to their MLAs and to local and Provincial Health authorities.

This is a multi-level program that provides the GCC with an opportunity to review and publicly recognize the progress and achievements of each Climate Action Charter (*Charter*) signatory.

Recognition is provided on an annual basis to local governments who demonstrate progress on their *Charter* commitments, according to the following:

Level 1: Progress on Charter Commitments

All local governments who demonstrate progress on fulfilling one or more of their *Charter* commitments will receive a letter from the GCC acknowledging their accomplishments.

Level 2: Measurement

Local governments who have completed a corporate carbon inventory for the reporting year and demonstrate that they are familiar with the Community Energy and Emissions Inventory (CEEI) will receive a 'Climate Action Community 2014' logo, for use on websites, letter head and similar.

Level 3: Achievement of Carbon Neutrality

To be eligible for this program, local governments will need to complete a Climate Action Revenue Incentive Program (CARIP)/ Carbon Neutral Progress Survey and submit it online to the Province in accordance with the program guidelines. I am pleased to advise that UBCM is in the process of distributing the first of two Community Works Fund (CWF) payments for fiscal 2015/2016. An electronic transfer of \$225,120.56 is expected to occur within the next 30 days. These payments are made in accordance with the payment schedule set out in your CWF Agreement with UBCM (see section 4 of your Agreement).

CWF is made available to eligible local governments by the Government of Canada pursuant to the Administrative Agreement on the Federal Gas Tax Fund in British Columbia. Funding under the program may be directed to local priorities that fall within one of the eligible project categories.





2015 Trans Canada Trail Work - Trails to the Boundary Society

Trails to the Boundary Society has a partnership agreement with Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resources Operations, Recreation Sites and Trails BC to perform trail maintenance and stewardship functions on the Trans-Canada Trail between McCullough Lake and Eholt, a section of trail that is 155 kilometers long.

Detail of Project Description

This project proposal includes three action items.

1. Trail Surface Repair at Hwy/Road crossings for safety

The Trans-Canada Trail (TCT) has sections of trail surface that is unsuitable for recreational users both local and visitors to the RDKB because of the loose and rocky trail surface. We have identified priority areas of the rail grade focused on user safety. We plan to "harden" 6 small sections of the trail surface so that visitors and residents who use the trail can do so safely. The areas we have identified are where Hwy 33 and Hwy 3 cross the rail grade, two road crossings in Greenwood and a section north of the Beaverdell portal.

Users of these highway crossings encounter loose trail surface which could impact how the visitor is able to effectively cross the highway. The planned work will be completed at Westbridge, Midway, Greenwood Dump Road, Greenwood West Side crossing, Greenwood North Portal where the Tunnel of Flags is located and about 5 km south of Eholt. Our plan is to use and place compact road grinding 25 feet back from the Hwy in all areas and the additional three sections identified. We will cooperate with permitting and coordination with the Ministry of Transportation, the Ministry of Forest, Lands and Natural Resources Operations and the governments of Midway and City of Greenwood.

2. Signage - Directional, KM Markers and Information

The maintenance of Trans-Canada Trail has the potential to contribute significant economic benefits to our local communities, and the Trails to the Boundary Society wants to position the TCT as an increased economic driver — offering increased opportunity for visitors to experience the natural and cultural heritage of the landscape as they travel. Signage is extremely poor for most sections of 155 km we are a stewardship group for and visitors find it confusing to follow sections of the trail. In addition, there are no kilometer markings on the trail, so in an emergency or critical situation it may be difficult for a user to describe how to be located.

We will place kilometer markers along the length of the rail trail. Directional signs will be placed to provide guidance where users experience confusion and have difficulty. We will also place signs to help encourage TCT users to remain on the trail and respect private property so there will be lessened chance of invasive species spreading and other resource damage to adjacent land owners. Lastly, we want to place new portal signs in key areas of local communities so community business owners will have benefit of users knowing what services are available, but also direct trail users to these services.

3. Measurement of Trail Use

Trail counters will be placed in two strategic points of the trail to find out statistics about who is using the trail. Four will be purchased because we want to be able to determine different users such as horses, hikers, ATV/UTV's, cyclists, horses. By having two counters at each point, we can measure pedestrian and "non-pedestrian" numbers.

ISSUE INTRODUCTION

Report Prepared by: Carly Rimell, Planner

Jock and Rona Hawkey have applied for a Development Permit to build an accessory building with a one bedroom sleeping quarter and an associated washroom facility (see Site Location Map).

The Development Permit and Development Permit Amendment process is to ensure that an adequate sewage treatment system is in place for any development within the Environmentally Sensitive Areas.

BACKGROUND FACTORS

The property is designated 'Waterfront Residential' in the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake OCP Bylaw No. 1250 and zoned 'Waterfront Residential 2' (R2) in the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake Zoning Bylaw No. 1300. The parcel is split by East Lake Drive

Page 1 of 3

 and abuts Christina Lake, placing it within the Waterfront Environmentally Sensitive Development Permit Area (Applicant's Submission). Currently the only structure on the property is a single family dwelling.

In April 2004, this parcel and the parcel to the south were subject to a boundary adjustment. The applicants adjusted their interior parcel line to the south as a cabin was significantly encroaching.

In February 2007, the applicants proposed removing the cabin and constructing a new single family dwelling. The owners received a Development Variance Permit (DVP), varying the front parcel line by 4m (from 4.5m to 0.5m). The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure also approved this.

At the same time the applicants also received a site specific exemption from the RDKB Floodplain Bylaw No. 677 to allow construction of the dwelling (an attached deck) within the floodplain setback distance from the natural boundary of Christina Lake by 4.8m (from 7.5m to 2.7m).

In April 2007, the owners applied for a Development Permit. In accordance with the Environmentally Sensitive Development Permit Area guidelines the applicants submitted a Sewerage Disposal System Assessment prepared by Richard Bartel, P.Eng, of One Point Engineering. Construction of this Type II system was completed August 19, 2008. The system has the capacity to support a four bedroom residence with a Daily Design Flow (DDF) of 1,704 Litres per Day (LPD). Presently, there is a 3 bedroom residence built at the site, leaving unused capacity in the treatment system and dispersal field (see Point One Engineering Development Permit Amendment Letter).

PROPOSAL

The applicants propose constructing a workshop with a one bedroom sleeping quarter and a shared washroom facility to be served by the existing Type II treatment and dispersal system.

IMPLICATIONS

There are no setback or floodplain development issues with the proposed location for the accessory building, nor any concerns with parcel coverage. The height of the accessory building is not specified, but the applicants are aware of the accessory buildings height restriction of 4.6m. Any issues on this can be addressed by the Building Inspection Department when the building permit application is made.

Parking is provided in accordance with the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake Zoning Bylaw Section 319.



The designed and installed treatment and dispersal system has the capacity to support a four (4) bedroom residence with a Daily Design Flow (DDF) of 1,704 Litres per Day (LPD). To date there is a three (3) bedroom residence built at the site, leaving unused capacity in treatment system and the dispersal field.

The construction of a workshop with a one (1) bedroom sleeping quarter and an associated washroom facility can be readily served by the existing installed treatment and dispersal system as there is unused capacity.

Additionally, Sewerage System Standard Practice Manual Version 3 requires that the (DDF) for a four (4) Bedrooms is 1,600 LPD. Original installed capacity was for 1,704 LPD, so more than adequate required capacity is available to be used for the addition of the shop with a one (1) bedroom sleeping quarter.
