ISSUE INTRODUCTION

The applicants have applied for a Development Permit to construct an office building with one attached guest accommodation unit, two detached guest accommodation units and two sheds on Santa Rosa Road (see Site Location Map; Site Plan). As the property is located in the General Commercial Development Permit Area, a development permit is required.

HISTORY / BACKGROUND FACTORS

The property is designated Highway Commercial in the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake OCP and zoned Highway Commercial 2 (C2) in the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake Zoning Bylaw. The property is within the General Commercial Development Permit Area.

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This property is undeveloped other than the two sheds referenced in this Development Permit Application. The owner began building these without a Building Permit or Development Permit and was issued a Stop Work Order by an RDKB Building Official. Afterwards he promptly contacted the Planning and Development Department to assemble his application.

PROPOSAL

The applicants propose to construct an office building for their vacation rental business, which includes a guest accommodation unit attached to the main office building, and two detached guest accommodation units functioning as a motel. These structures would be in addition to the sheds which have already been built (see Applicants' Submission).

IMPLICATIONS

A Development Permit is required for all new buildings and structures in the General Commercial Development Permit Area. The following guidelines have been established for development in this area. Wording in italics relate to this development proposal.

Building Siting and Finish

Buildings should be sited to face a public road or open space such as a square. The rear walls of buildings should not be visible from a public road or street.

Buildings shall be finished on all sides with consistent exterior materials and colours to be used on all building facades. An artistic rendering showing the building in colour shall be provided.

The applicant's plans propose earth tone shades of brown and rock work detailing for the proposed office and guest accommodation units (see Applicants' Submission). The office building is sited to face Santa Rosa Road as per requirement.

Access, Parking and Traffic

Buildings shall have safe, practical access and parking areas for passenger vehicles. A plan showing parking areas with proposed traffic circulation patterns must be provided. Parking areas and driveways for new developments on vacant land should have paved or concrete surfaces. Expansions to existing developments should be surfaced with a material which minimizes dust. Paved or concrete surfaces are encouraged. The site and parking plan will be referred to the Ministry of Transportation for their approval.

The design and layout of buildings and parking areas shall address and promote pedestrian activity and should include features such as low profile lighting,

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sidewalks, landscaping, street furniture, obvious building access points and parking areas that emphasize pedestrian safety and convenience.

Safe pedestrian connections shall be provided from parking areas to the building's main entry.

Appropriate fire-truck and other emergency vehicle access must be ensured. The Christina Lake Fire Chief may be asked to comment on applications.

Access will be from Santa Rosa Road, no new access is proposed. The applicants propose 6 parking stalls within close vicinity to the office. Two parking stalls will be provided for their guest accommodation units and 4 for their office, in accordance with the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake Zoning Bylaw 1300 Section 319 Parking Requirements.

The applicants plan to pave the entry from Santa Rosa Road and cover the remaining parking lot in road mulch, a mixture of sand, clay, and rock to create a compact surface and aid in dust abatement.

Pedestrians will have convenient access from parking to the main office building. There will also be exterior lighting on the proposed buildings for those arriving in the dark.

Landscaping and Signage

Landscaping should be implemented to enhance the appearance of the commercial area.

Developments which involve multiple uses on one property are strongly encouraged. Any development, which incorporates the concept of a well designed central gathering place and focus for the community, will be favourably received.

Signs should be consistent with building designs and complement their surroundings.

For landscaping, the applicants will be retaining as many of the existing trees as possible for a natural forest look.

The proposed sign to be placed on this parcel was used at a property where the vacation rentals office previously operated. It abides by the Signs Section 318 within the Electoral Area 'C'/Christina Lake Zoning Bylaw No. 1300.

IMPLICATIONS

The parcel is in the Highway 'Commercial 2 Zone' (C2). Establishment of an office and motel (guest accommodation units) are permitted uses, and consistent with the commercial objectives and policies in the OCP. The applicant plans to hire a certified installer for the septic system.

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The authority to issue Development Permits is delegated to the Manager of Planning and Development.

REFERRALS

This application has been referred to the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure and the Christina Lake Fire Chief for comments.

The Christina Lake Fire Chief responded by saying he is familiar with the property and has no concerns.

Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure has decided to do a site inspection before providing final comments regarding the development. The site visit will be conducted on April 15th along with a staff member from the Planning and Development Department. An update regarding the site visit will be provided at the EAS meeting from the Manager of Planning and Development. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure has also requested further information from the applicants.

- "A drawing showing where all buildings will be placed on the property, as well as all parking areas.
 - The drawing must show how cars/RV's/trailers will be entering and exiting the property, and
 - o Be able to prove adequate turning radii for larger vehicles.
- Applicants to determine expected traffic volumes during peak times.
- Applicants to apply for an access permit for a commercial use property."

ADVISORY PLANNING COMMISSION COMMENTS

The Electoral Area 'C'/ Christina Lake Advisory Planning Commission provided the following comments:

"A representative of Christina Waterworks District had spoken to David Durand and advised that the District confirmed that they are able to supply water to this proposed development.

After discussion, the APC requests that Planning advise whether or not a septic engineer will be required, in that it is our understanding that all Commercial Developments in Area 'C' require engineering. No other comments on this application."

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

The Planning and Development Department is pleased to hear that the Christina Waterworks District is able to supply water to the proposed development. The subject property is not within the Environmentally Sensitive Waterfront Development Permit Area, therefore a report from a qualified professional regarding the sewage disposal system is not required. It is a requirement of The Ministry of Health for a Registered Onsite Wastewater Practitioner to install the system on the subject property.

The Development Permit will be issued when the Planning and Development Department is satisfied that any of The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's concerns have been addressed.

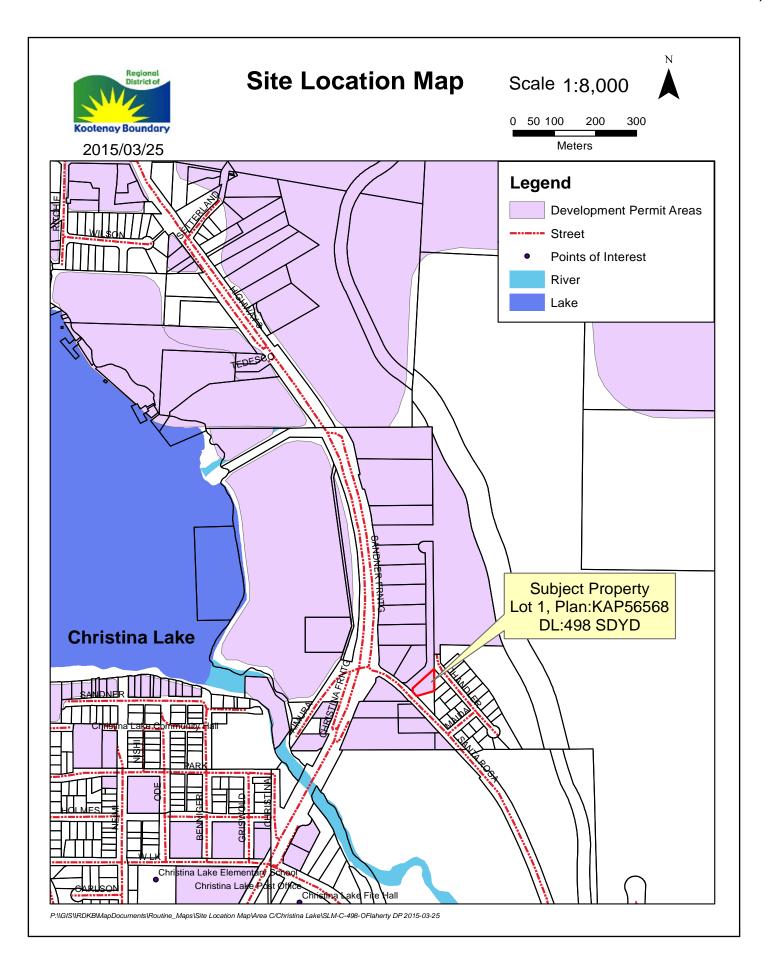

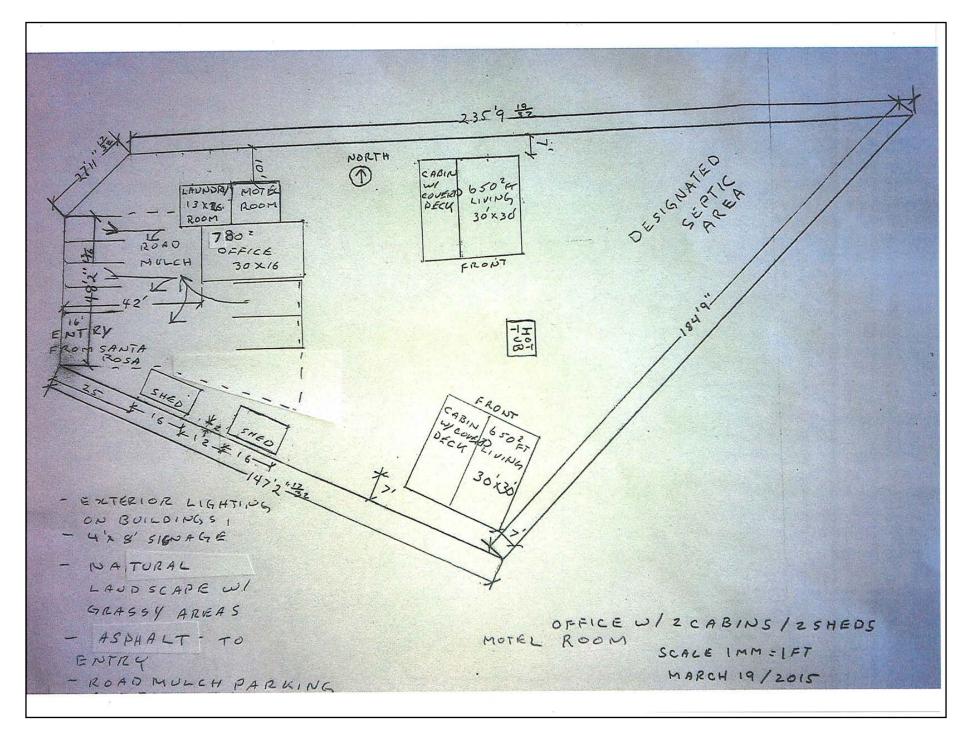

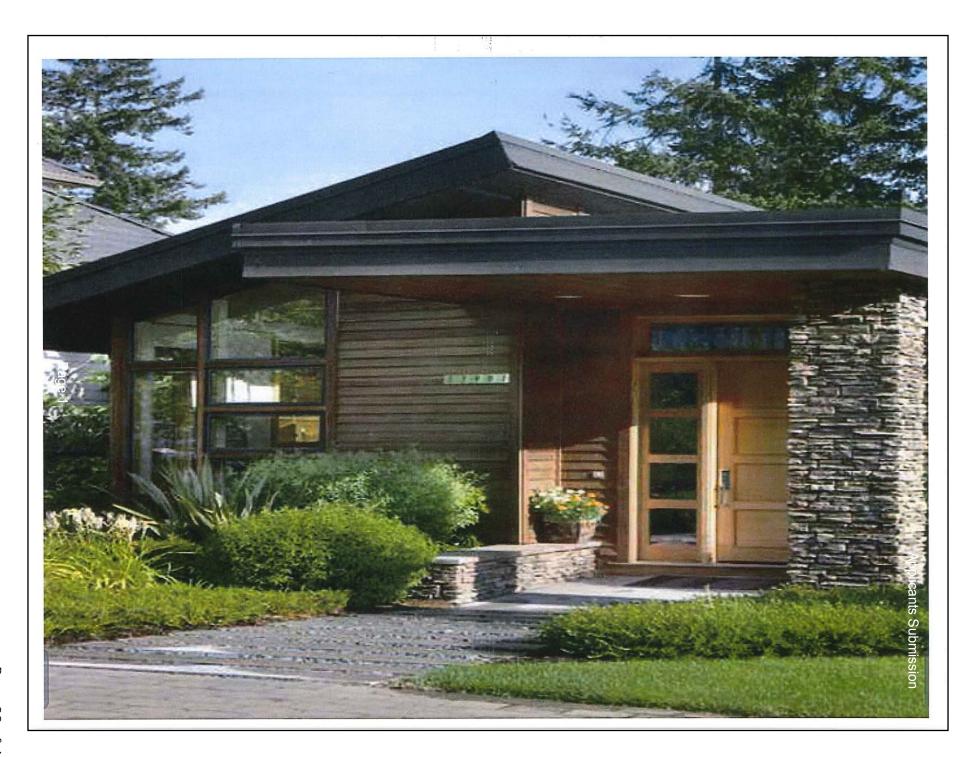

Issue Introduction

The purpose of this report is to introduce to the Electoral Area Services Committee a proposal to have the Community Energy Association (CEA) utilize Fortis BC and CBT funding to produce a Community Energy and Emissions Plan for the RDKB.

History/Background Factors

In 2008, the Province enacted legislation requiring all local governments to plan to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions within their boundaries. The Province divided the emissions into two categories for local governments: corporate GHG emissions and community-wide GHG emissions. Corporate GHG emissions are those directly attributable to the operations of the local government (eg. landfill gas, recreational and administrative facilities heating, corporate vehicle emissions, etc.). To address its corporate emissions, the RDKB worked through the Community Energy Association (CEA) and Columbia Basin Trust (CBT) with RDCK, RDEK, 29 member municipalities, and six First Nations on the Carbon Neutral Kootenays Project which established an energy and emissions plan for the corporate operations of all of the participating local governments in the region.

For community-wide GHG emissions, the Province mandated, through legislation, that all local governments must include in their official community plans (OCPs) targets, policies and actions with respect to GHG reduction. "Community-wide emissions" are those emanating from within the community which are not part of the local government's corporate operations (eg. home heating, vehicle emissions, industrial emissions, etc.). Since the legislation was enacted, each of the RDKB's OCPs has been amended to include objectives and policies intended to control community-wide GHG emissions in line with the Provincial targets.

The Province set the following targets for GHG reductions:

- 33% reduction below 2007 levels by 2020; and
- 80% reduction below 2007 levels by 2050.

The RDKB's GHG reduction policies in the various OCPs are intended to influence GHG emissions by addressing such issues as urban sprawl, reductions in vehicle use, the encouragement of cycling and pedestrian corridors, and the promotion of compact, energy-

Proposal

The CEA has approached staff with a proposal to prepare a Community Energy and Emissions Plan (CEEP) for the RDKB, along with other Kootenay regional districts and communities, and to make a joint funding application on behalf of those regional districts and communities. A CEEP would build on the existing OCP policies relating GHG reduction to create a more detailed plan to better control to energy consumption and emissions in the RDKB.

Fortis BC has announced some funding available to Kootenay and Boundary communities for energy planning — up to 50% for CEEPs in 2015/2016. The CEA is proposing to approach CBT on behalf of the Kootenay and Boundary communities served by Fortis to find matching funding for the preparation of the various CEEPs. Local governments might be expected to provide some in-kind contributions (i.e. meeting space, staff time), but the CEEPs would be prepared and delivered by the CEA. This would be a similar process to that which the CEA has already delivered, fully-funded, to Kootenay communities served by BC Hydro (eg. Valemount, Nakusp, Silverton) utilizing the BC Hydro Quickstart program. If there is interest, the CEA proposes to put together a joint local government proposal to Fortis BC and CBT. It is intended that the funding application to those bodies would include implementation support in addition to the preparation of the plan.

Implications (Financial, Policy/Practice, Interdepartmental or Intergovernmental)

The attached Fortis BC document provides information with respect to the program. It is CEA's intent that, in making the funding application on behalf of Kootenay and Boundary communities, the program costs will be fully funded through Fortis BC and CBT. There would be some staff time required and perhaps the provision of meeting space, but otherwise the program would be completely delivered by CEA staff utilizing the Fortis BC and CBT funding.

Summary

The purpose of this report is to outline the CEA proposal to utilize Fortis BC's PowerSense Program to develop Community Energy and Emissions Plans for Kootenay and Boundary communities. At this point, the CEA is enquiring as to which regional districts and communities have an interest in the CEA putting together a joint local government proposal on their behalf for the development of fully-funded CEEPs through Fortis BC and CBT.

Alternatives

- 1. Receive the staff report and support the CEA submitting a funding application on the RDKB's behalf to Fortis BC and CBT.

Strategic COMMUNITY ENERGY PLANNING

Background

FortisBC is committed to helping its customers achieve sustainability through PowerSense initiatives that conserve energy and get the most out of energy dollars spent. Powersense provides financial incentives and support for energy-efficient technologies, practices, design and planning.

Local governments and large publically-funded institutions spend hundreds of thousands of dollars a year on energy to provide public services and meet constituent needs. At the same time, in many buildings, energy costs can be reduced by 20 percent or more through a number of energy efficiency measures and approaches. Local governments and public institutions have the potential to reduce energy waste and provide savings to taxpayers by developing energy strategic plans that focus on energy use in their existing and future buildings and operations (e.g., building improvements, wastewater treatment plants, street and parking lot lights). Particularly in a time of tightening budgets and rising energy costs, developing a strategic energy plan can be an important component of good governance, and it can put public institutions in a prime position to capture future savings, because they have proactively identified their goals and priority actions.

Funding Support

FortisBC has created a PowerSense fund to provide financial assistance to local governments and publically-funded institutions to facilitate energy efficiency planning activities. Public institutions can apply to receive up to \$20,000 to support planning activities, which could include development of community energy efficient strategic plans, energy efficient design practices and organizational policies like energy efficiency building code bylaws. The planning must be aimed at specifically reducing electricity usage and demand. ¹

Eligibility

Any local government (municipality and regional district) or regionally based publically-funded institution (i.e., education, health) located within the FortisBC electricity service area may apply for 50 percent of a project's cost up to \$20,000 in 2015-2016. Funding is limited, and awarded on a first come basis, so applicants are encouraged to file their funding requests early in the calendar year.

How to Apply

An eligible² organization is required to write a proposal to FortisBC PowerSense. The proposal should be four pages or less and include the following information:

- Description of local government or publically-funded institution
- Description of strategic planning initiative, including expected outcomes (especially electricity savings outcomes), and timelines

¹ The Strategic Energy Planning fund is not intended for individual building energy audits or retro-fits. FortisBC PowerSense has other funding programs available for that purpose.

² Contact your key account manager (if known), or Carol Suhan to determine eligibility

- Description of key stakeholders and consultants or staff that will be involved in the project
- An overview of the project's budget, including the funding provided by the institution
- FortisBC will issue a formal acceptance letter, confirming our co-funding amount, upon acceptance of the proposal
- Payment will be made upon receipt and acceptance of the Final report

Reporting Requirements

Upon approval, it is expected that the institution would provide the following:

- Progress reports, frequency and content to be defined upon acceptance
- A copy of the final report

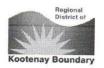

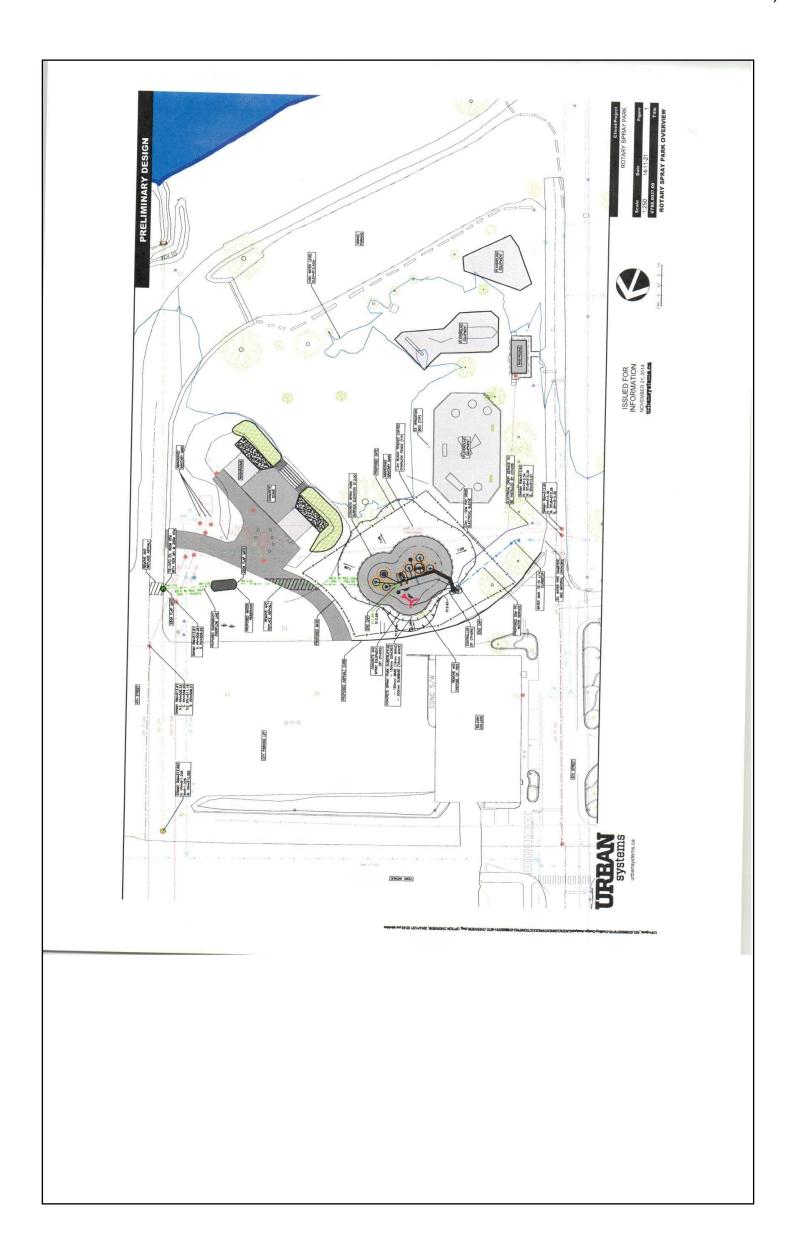
